

NSQH 2022 Abstract Submission Guidelines

Posters and oral presentations (for Workshops, see below)

Please follow these rules when submitting an abstract:

The presenting author must attend the conference as a registered delegate. NSQH wants to provide high-quality sessions focused on educational content that is free from commercial influence or bias. Thus, please declare any potential conflicts of interest for all authors during abstract submission. The abstract must be no more than 550 words, excluding abstract title but including abstract body and possible references.

Please structure the abstract into the following sections:

- **A title** clearly indicating the nature of the study.
- **Introduction** to include problem description and summary of available knowledge.
- **Objectives** that clearly indicate the scientific question and objectives of the study and its clinical (or other) importance in 1-2 sentences.
- **Methods** that should contain sufficient information for the reader to understand the research design, the analytical techniques used in the study. Please document ethical considerations.
- **Results** should contain objective data to answer the scientific question(s). This could include associations between interventions and outcomes, including unintended consequences.
- **Conclusion** should provide only conclusion of the study directly supported by the results, along with implication for clinical practice, avoiding speculation and overgeneralization.
- **References**, please note that this field is not mandatory, however it will be included in the word count.

Please ensure your abstract does not contain spelling, grammar, or scientific mistakes, as NSQH will reproduce it as submitted. Please make sure to define all abbreviations.

Please choose among the key topics (maximum 3) that you think reflect your abstract best.

Abstracts should be submitted by 24th April.

Authors will be notified of acceptance of their proposal no later than 5th June.

Workshops

We will have a limited number of workshops during the NSQH 2020 conference.

Please follow these rules when submitting a workshop proposal:

NSQH wants to provide high-quality sessions focused on educational content that is free from commercial influence or bias. Thus, please declare any potential conflicts of interest for all authors during abstract submission.

- Workshops should be as interactive as possible. Therefore we ask for your approach to facilitation.
- Workshops are 90 minutes.
- We encourage Nordic researchers to propose workshops, preferably - but not necessarily - so that two or more Nordic researchers from different countries jointly organize a workshop.

Please structure the proposal for your workshop into the following sections:

- A title clearly indicating the nature of the workshop.
- Names of presenters: (title, place of work, max 80 words of biographical information)
- Teaser (max 250 words)
- During this workshop you will learn (max three bullet points)
- Plan for facilitation (group discussions at round tables, world café, rapid fire with questions... sky is the limit). Please make sure to define all abbreviations.

Abstracts should be submitted by 24th April.

The workshop proposers will be notified of acceptance at the latest 5th June and if accepted contacted by the conference organizers to discuss and plan the workshop.
